The Directors of The Muslim Jewish Forum of Greater Manchester present their annual report together with the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2023.

Our purpose

The objects for which the Forum is established are to develop the cultural and social ties between the Muslim and Jewish Communities of Greater Manchester; to educate members of the Muslim and Jewish Communities in relation to their shared values and common Abrahamic tradition, heritage, history and culture; maximising their potential and improving their health and well-being as residents of Greater Manchester; and to promote better understanding within the wider community of the interests and values that are common to the Muslim and Jewish Communities.

During the year, the Forum has held a number of events to further these objects:

With the end of the coronavirus pandemic, the Forum resumed holding in-person events, as well as continuing to hold some events online where appropriate. When events are held online, we record them and publish appropriate parts on our website. They can all be found via our "News and past events" page.

26 June 2022 — Trip To Leeds. 20 participants went on a day trip to Leeds to meet members of the Muslim and Jewish communities, including visits to a synagogue and a mosque.

24 July 2022 — Annual picnic. 25 participants enjoyed a picnic in St Mary's Park in Prestwich and listened to a talk by the Christian Wakeford MP whose constituency includes the park.

20 November 2022 — History presentation. 25 participants attended a talk given over Zoom by Robert Kantor on his research into how British and European Muslims and Jews set aside the Palestine conflict to cooperate against fascism in the period 1933 – 1942.

15 January 2023 — Annual kosher meal. 34 people enjoyed a kosher meal at Celia's Kitchen in Prestwich. The guest speaker was the Mayor of Bury Cllr Shaheena Haroon.

26 February 2023 — Leeds people's return visit to Manchester. 35 people altogether visited Manchester Jewish Museum and Manchester Central Mosque, The speakers included the Ceremonial Mayor of Salford, the Lord Mayor of Manchester, and MP for Manchester Gorton Afzal Khan CBE.

26 March 2023 — Annual iftar. After a four-year gap due to the coronavirus pandemic, 50 people enjoyed an iftar meal at Khizra Mosque with several high profile speakers including the Lord Lieutenant of Greater Manchester Diane Hawkins.

The Forum also supported other organisations' events. Some of these are listed below:

10 August 2022 — Adam Day. Our Co-Chair Cllr Heather Fletcher spoke at the 20th Adam Day celebration organised by the Azeemia Foundation.

23 October 2022 — Mothers Against Violence community event in Hulme. Both of our Co-Chairs, Cllr Heather Fletcher and Mohammed Amin MBE about the work of the Muslim Jewish Forum.

Financial accounts

The financial accounts, which comprise an Income and Expenditure Account and a Balance Sheet, are set out on the following pages. Due to the small size of the company's turnover and assets, the accounts are not required to be audited.

During the year, the Forum had total receipts of \pounds 1,302.41 and total expenditures of \pounds 1,414.80 resulting in an overall deficit of \pounds 112.39 as detailed in the Income and Expenditure account. The overall financial position is considered satisfactory.

Charitable status

The Forum is registered as a charity with HM Revenue & Customs with effect from 9 May 2014. Accordingly, donors to the Forum who are taxpayers are requested to complete a gift aid declaration which can be downloaded from the "Join us" section of our website. Donors to the Forum who are higher rate taxpayers should be able to claim higher rate tax relief through self-assessment for their donations.
